Position Purpose

The objective of this position is to provide a full time Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Fellow role that is responsible for overseeing the general running of the unit and its activities in collaboration with the unit registrars.

In particular:

- Provide supervisory role and mentorship to Registrars and Residents in clinical and operative care of patients.
- Oversee and direct the clinical management of patients in collaboration with unit consultants.
- Undertake both emergency and elective surgery independently and facilitate emergency operating.
- Provide leave cover for consultant operating and outpatient sessions.
- Provide leave cover for General Surgery registrars of the unit.

About Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery

The Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery sits within the SAPM Division, part of the Operations Directorate, comprises the following departments which operate across both the Austin Hospital and Repatriation Hospital sites.

The Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Unit provides high level Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery services to patients across Austin Health.

The unit provides specialist Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery services and an after-hours on call service. The unit maintains an ongoing commitment to research, teaching and training.

The Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Unit is supported by a Divisional Manager, Quality Coordinator, Finance, HR and Business Support as part of the SAPM Division.

Purpose and Accountabilities

Role Specific:

There are a number of surgical sessions and outpatient sessions per week at the Austin Campus and The Surgery Centre, Repatriation Campus.

Clinical Care

- Participate in registrar presentations, audits and medical students teaching
- Attend to all referrals within 12 hours
- Participate in Unit meetings and Clinical sessions including MDT
- Participate in the on-call roster as required
- Perform after hours work and night duty as required
- Provide a consultative service to other Units as required
- Cover other surgical units as requested by the Hospital

- Demonstrate a commitment to working as a team member with peer medical, resident, nursing and other staff to provide efficient, safe and quality care across the continuum
- Participate in the auditing and review of clinical practices to improve clinical outcomes
- Attendance at Division of Surgery audit is compulsory and attendance at Surgical Grand Rounds is expected.

Teaching and training

- Participate in both Under Graduate and Post Graduate teaching.
- Maintain log book

Research & Education

- Support is available for conferences and educational sessions.
- Research is encouraged.

Other

• Assist the Head of Unit in administrative duties as required.
