The Amputee, Ortho & General Rehab MO position manages all relevant inpatients on the Mellor unit and outpatients in the Ortho & General Rehab clinic, with the support of the Amputee, Ortho & General Rehabilitation Medicine Physician, as well as caring for the Amputee & Disability outpatients and consulting on patients at the Austin Hospital with the support of the Amputee outpatient & Consults Rehabilitation Medicine Physician and the Disability Service Rehabilitation Medicine Physician. In doing so they ensure patient-centred, high quality, clinically appropriate care is delivered, at the right time and in the right place. The MO will also supervise the HMOs and the patient care provided by the HMOs.

About Rehabilitation Medicine

Rehabilitation Medicine at Austin Health provides a range of services on the Austin Hospital and Royal Talbot Rehabilitation centre (RTRC) campuses. RTRC is a specialist rehabilitation centre of international standard, providing a comprehensive and coordinated range of services to clients with a wide range of needs. These include inpatient, outpatient and domiciliary programs for people with spinal cord injury, acquired brain injury, amputations, multiple trauma, orthopaedic and neurological conditions.

Purpose and Accountabilities

Role Specific:

- Responsibility for inpatients in the Amputee, Ortho & General Rehab unit, either directly or through supervision of the HMO.
- Responsibility for outpatients in the Amputee, Disability and Ortho & General Rehab clinics.
- Assessment of Austin patients as regards suitability for rehabilitation.
- Take a leadership role in team coordination under the direction of the relevant consultant.
- Participation in the relevant Royal Talbot on-call roster.
- Attendance at ward rounds, case conferences, family meetings, outpatient clinics.
- Responsibility for completion of discharge summaries, and liaison with GP, specialist if required.
- Participation in on-site teaching program.
- To liaise with Austin Health Medical, Nursing, Allied Health, patient's carers and GP, ensuring patient-centred, high quality, clinically appropriate care is delivered to the right person at the right time and in the right place.
- Ensure a high level of work quality; develop, implement, and monitor quality improvement activities within the department/ward, in accordance with Austin Health Policies.
- Participate in emergency incident response activities as required.

All Employees:

- Comply with Austin Health policies & procedures as amended from time to time
