Position purpose

As a member of the Nuclear Medicine Team, the AHA provides clinical and administration support to the Molecular Imaging and Therapy workforce in order to provide an efficient service to the Molecular Imaging and Therapy Department. The AHA will also be responsible for helping to improve and support the patient journey through the Molecular Imaging and Therapy Department.

The AHA will also support the nuclear medicine technologists in compliance through adherence to relevant policy/guidelines/standards.

About the Directorate/Division/Department

The Department of Molecular Imaging and Therapy has four core service components – NM, PET, BMD and Radionuclide Therapy. The Austin Campus operates with four SPECT/CT gamma cameras, three PET/CT scanners, an 18 MeV cyclotron, state of the art radiochemistry and radiopharmacy laboratories, extensive physics and chemistry support and research facilities. Repatriation Campus has two BMD scanners for the BMD service.

The Department has 2 locations within Austin Health. Nuclear Medicine imaging, radionuclide therapy, and PET services are located at the Austin Campus on Level 1 of the Harold Stokes Building. Bone Densitometry services are located at the Repat Campus on Level 2 of the Centaur Building.

Position responsibilities

Role Specific:

- Assist with directing patient travels within the department
- Assist with scintigraphic procedures under the supervision of the NM Technologists in accordance with the Scanning Procedure Manual (SPM) and processing of computer generated data.
- When rostered within PET, under supervision of the NM Technologists, provide some assistance for the provision of clinical PET scans
- Administrative assistance with patient appointments, under supervision of the NM Technologists.
- Assist the NM Technologists to implement Quality Assurance activities to improve service delivery.
- Other duties as required and as directed by supervisors including maintenance of a safe and clean working environment.

Selection criteria

Essential skills and experience:

- Demonstrated ability to work within a multi-disciplinary team environment.
- Demonstrated flexibility and ability to adapt constructively within a busy and dynamic working environment
- Demonstrated understanding of, and desire to work in the role
- Demonstrated ability to quickly acquire knowledge relating to the functions the Molecular Imaging and Therapy Department as well as being able to adapt to a changing environment with regard to work processes and managing workloads.
- Demonstrated attributes of care, patience and empathy with patient centered focus
- Demonstrated initiative, effective problem solving skills and a positive attitude.
- Must have flexibility in work ethic. The Department's clinical activities often require staff to work overtime at no notice.
- Must be prepared to work at either Austin or Heidelberg Repatriation Hospitals.



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Desirable but not essential:

- Medical terminology knowledge
- Previous experience in patient care in a health environment
- Highly desirable to be currently enrolled in an undergraduate degree in Applied Science (Medical Radiations) in Nuclear Medicine Technology or accepted equivalent or Basic Sciences, however applicants outside this criterion will also be considered
- Previous Allied Health Experience
