Position purpose

The Clinical Neuropsychologist Grade 2 will primarily provide rehabilitation clinical services to patients at the Royal Talbot Rehabilitation Centre. The role, however, may also include clinical duties on the Repatriation campus of Austin Health, in addition to home-based and community rehabilitation services.

Clinical services incorporate the provision of neuropsychological assessment, therapeutic intervention and psychoeducation to patients with acquired brain injuries, neurological, orthopaedic, spinal and chronic health conditions.

The position is based primarily on inpatient rehabilitation units and may include work within at home rehabilitation programs (Better@Home) and community rehabilitation services. Neuropsychology involvement in Better@Home is brief, and time limited, with care provided in the patient's home or via telehealth.

The position works closely within multidisciplinary teams to provide a high quality, evidence-based service to improve patient outcomes.

The clinician employed in this position reports to the Neuropsychology Rehabilitation Lead. Travel across the three campuses of Austin Health will be required. Adoption of a flexible

approach to clinical caseload management and the provision of care during periods of planned and unplanned leave will be necessary. To this end, the position may involve work within other clinical units and programs of Austin Health as per service demands.

About Psychology

This position is located within the Psychology Department, which is part of the Allied Health Division, Operations Directorate.

The Department of Psychology (General Health) comprises clinical psychologists and clinical neuropsychologists who work across the three Austin Health campuses. The department's clinical psychologists and clinical neuropsychologists provide diagnostic, assessment, intervention, and rehabilitation services to a broad range of inpatient, outpatient and community rehabilitation units. This includes neurosciences, oncology, aged care, subacute rehabilitation, community rehabilitation and medical/surgical units.

The Department of Psychology is committed to promoting the highest levels of psychological support and intervention for our patients. In realising this goal, the Department leads and excels in research, teaching, and the use of person-centred evidence-based practice. The Psychology Department supports many post-graduate student placements and has a dedicated Registrar program for both clinical psychology and clinical neuropsychology graduates. The Department also has significant involvement in both independent and collaborative research projects through partnerships with universities and research institutes.

Better@Home is a multidisciplinary inpatient services allowing patients to continue their care at home, where appropriate, and preferred by the individual.

Position responsibilities

Role Specific:

- Provide excellent, patient centred, evidence based clinical care to patients within inpatient rehabilitation wards at Royal Talbot Rehabilitation Centre, as well as on the Repatriation campus, and to home-based and community-rehabilitation services, as required.
- Conduct specialist neuropsychological assessments and prepare clinical reports for patients as required; provide clinical feedback and psychoeducation to patients, family and team members, as indicated.
- Formulate targeted rehabilitation strategies and programs in conjunction with the patient and their multi-disciplinary treatment team.
- Develop and implement proactive behaviour support programs in conjunction with the patient and their multi-disciplinary treatment team; monitor, evaluate and revise behaviour support plans as required.
- Provide high level consultation regarding complex clinical care and discharge planning issues to the multidisciplinary team and external organisations, as required.
- Provide consultation and support in the form of cognitive, behavioural and psychological strategies to assist staff and families.
- Other duties, as directed by the Neuropsychology Rehabilitation Lead, Head of Neuropsychology, or Director of Psychology.



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Quality and Risk

- Undertake and model evidence-based practice principles and interdisciplinary practice in the provision of care.
- Undertake in activities and audits, as required, to support compliance with the national standards.
- Ensure personal compliance with mandatory training requirements.
- Maintain appropriate statistics, case notes and records, and participate in departmental meetings as required.
- Participate in the development, implementation and evaluation of policy and service provision using evidence-based quality improvement methodology.
- Other duties as required and appropriate.

Professional Development

- Participate in department performance appraisal, supervision and professional development planning process.
- Undertake education and training to ensure clinical practice is current and evidence-based.

Information Management

- Maintain clinical records in accordance with relevant policy/procedures and Austin Health documentation standards.
- Adhere to Austin Health's policies for the use of Information Technology.
- Maintain accurate statistics, as per relevant policy and procedures.

Selection criteria

Essential skills and experience:

- Demonstrated capacity to provide neuropsychological assessments, clinical case formulations, and interventions for people with a range of general medical and neurological conditions.
- Demonstrated capacity to liaise with external agencies and to implement appropriate community referrals to relevant service providers
- Demonstrated ability to work as a member of a multidisciplinary team and as an independent clinician
- Demonstrated commitment to evidence based practice and ability to translate this into practice
- Highly developed written and verbal communication skills that provide effective liaison and consultation with a wide range of individuals, agencies and service providers.
- Demonstrated ability to undertake professional supervision.
- Willingness to seek, accept, and benefit from constructive feedback in relation to professional activities.



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Professional qualifications and registration requirements

- A postgraduate degree (i.e., minimum Masters level) in Clinical Neuropsychology from an accredited university course.
- Current registration as a psychologist with the Ahpra Psychology Board of Australia (PsyBA) in accordance with the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (Victoria) Act 2009.
- Hold area endorsement in clinical neuropsychology (PsyBA).
