Position Purpose

This position is responsible for the establishment, direction, planning, provision and review of clinical pharmacy services to the Kidney Transplant Service as part of the Australian Centre for Transplant Excellence and Research (ACTER) at Austin Health.

The role will work in collaboration with a Liver Transplant Pharmacist to leverage efficiencies in pharmacy service provision to ACTER and provide cover for transplant pharmacy services during periods of leave.

Key customers are: patients; the Kidney Transplant Service, including referring and collaborating health services, general practitioners and private specialists; ACTER; nursing, medical, pharmacy and other hospital staff.

Austin Health Pharmacy Department provides comprehensive high-quality care to Austin Health patients and supports other members of the healthcare team in all aspects of medicines management. The team consists of pharmacists and technical and support personnel who work together to ensure patients receive the highest quality pharmaceutical care possible.

About ACTER

Austin Health is a major provider of transplant services, delivering comprehensive transplant services in the areas of liver, kidney, intestinal, and haematopoietic stem cell transplantation. In addition to providing transplant services, Austin Health currently coordinates and performs the majority of abdominal organ retrieval in Victoria and Tasmania, including liver, intestine, kidney, and pancreas retrieval. Austin Health provides support for the paediatric abdominal organ transplant programs at the Royal Children's Hospital.

Austin Health is establishing the Australian Centre for Transplantation Excellence and Research (ACTER). Through ACTER, Austin Health will seek excellence in transplantation innovation and clinical care. This will be achieved by bringing together cutting-edge clinical practice, transplant-optimised operational systems, and active consumer participation. and multi-disciplinary expertise, positioning Austin Health as a leader in organ retrieval and transplantation.

About the Kidney Transplant Service

The Austin Health Kidney Transplant Service offers comprehensive, patient-centred transplantation care. We provide end-to-end care, covering pre-transplant evaluation, the transplantation procedure, and post-transplant care for both public and private patients from regional and metropolitan areas.

Our pre-transplant workup and education program aims to maximise timely transplant opportunities and outcomes for individuals with advanced kidney disease. This program includes pre-transplant evaluation and care for both recipient and living donor candidates, multidisciplinary assessment for higher-risk transplants, and education for patients and their families.

Additionally, we offer specialised services in transplant urology, cardiology, infectious disease, dermatology, and renal genetics for recipients and donors with inherited kidney diseases. We work closely with the Victorian Transplantation and Immunogenetics Service.

We are home to the Victorian and Tasmanian Kidney Machine Perfusion Program, which aims to improve access to and outcomes from deceased donor kidney transplantation. This program includes both hypothermic oxygenated machine perfusion and normothermic machine perfusion, and serves patients in Victoria and Tasmania in collaboration with the Victorian and Tasmanian Organ Retrieval Service (VICTORS), also based at Austin Health.

Our transplantation services include:

- Living donor transplantation (both direct and through the kidney exchange program)
- Deceased donor transplantation
- Blood type incompatible transplantation
- Multiorgan transplantation
- High immunological risk kidney transplantation

Following transplantation, we provide a comprehensive post-transplant program focused on maximising long-term health. This includes preventive healthcare, early diagnosis, and treatment of transplant-related health issues. Our services are flexible to accommodate shared care arrangements with private nephrologists or referring health services.

Purpose and Accountabilities

Transplantation is a key focus of service delivery and excellence at Austin Health. Austin Health performs roughly 180 solid organ transplants per year (100 liver and 80 kidney) and cares for 1800 living donors and recipients via outpatient clinics. Additional transplant service provision occurs via shared care arrangements with regional and referring health services, along with private specialists.

The Grade 3 Transplant Pharmacist (Kidney) will be embedded in the multidisciplinary team to provide inpatient and outpatient clinical pharmacy services to this complex patient cohort.

The following activities are components of the position to assist in meeting the key responsibilities:

Role Specific

Provide high quality, safe and efficient clinical pharmacy services to ACTER, with a focus on the kidney transplant service:

Pre-transplant:

- Attend pre-transplant workup outpatient clinics to undertake a comprehensive medication review, assess medication adherence and provide education.
- Support pre-transplant preparations including implementation of desensitization plans.

Post-transplant:

- Coordinate and support effective transitions of care.
- Attend post-transplant outpatient clinics to provide medication management, adherence support, side-effect monitoring, and preventive care for organ transplant recipients.
- Contribute to the continuous education of patients, caregivers, and healthcare providers, ensuring comprehensive understanding of transplant medications and therapy plans.
- Support implementation and follow-up of treatment plans, including the management of rejection.
- Support coordination of medication supply and access.
- Ensure continuity of care to community health care providers.
- Provide an outpatient advisory service to outpatients and their care providers including family, GPs, and other specialists
- Attend weekly audit meetings and MDMs

Outcome measures:

- High-quality, clinical pharmacy service, medication recommendations and review for transplant patients delivered.
- Improved patient medication adherence and accuracy.
- Meet NWAU activity measures.

Quality Improvement:

- Assist in the development and ongoing review of policies and procedures relating to transplantation.
- Participate in quality improvement and research activity and identify service improvement opportunities.
- Represent Austin Health and ACTER across transplantation professional societies and special interest groups.

Outcome measures:

- Optimal, safe and cost-effective medication is provided.
- Medication safety and service improvement initiatives implemented across transplant medicine.
- Policies and procedures established and maintained.

Other responsibilities:

- Attend Kidney Transplant Service audit meetings and MDMs (as appropriate)
- Engage with ACTER working groups and development initiatives (as appropriate)
- Contribute to the overall management of the Pharmacy Department through active participation as a member of senior management and support strategic priorities of Austin Health
- Participate in weekend and public holiday roster for Pharmacy Department
- Participate in on-call roster for Pharmacy Department
- Other duties as required by the Director or Deputy Director of Pharmacy.

- 10. Ability to liaise with medical, nursing, pharmacy and administrative staff
- 11. Proven ability to identify and solve problems and to prioritise tasks
- 12. Ability to evaluate medical literature
- 13. Competent computer skills in MS office applications
