Position Purpose

The Medical Oncologist in this position holds a leadership role within the Medical Oncology unit as a Tumour Stream Lead in gynae-oncology and provides leadership in the tumour stream through collaboration with the Mercy Hospital for Women. The position has strong functional relationships with Mercy Hospital for Women, which is the designated gynae-oncology service on the Austin Health/Mercy Hospital for Women precinct.

The position provides clinical management and treatment of patients of Mercy Hospital for Women, and includes:

- Consultative, diagnostic, procedural, and outpatient specialty services, and any other services as determined and required by Austin Health and Mercy Hospital for Women from time to time;
- Undergraduate and postgraduate teaching, research and supervision;
- Participation in quality activities, professional development and continuing education; and,
- Leadership in clinical service delivery in gynae-oncology at Mercy Hospital for Women.

Given the strong relationship of this position to Mercy Hospital for Women, the appointee will additionally comply with the policies and procedures of Mercy Hospital for Women.

The appointee will perform the duties of this position efficiently to the standards of the Medical Oncology department, including participating in the pertinent performance appraisal programs.

About Medical Oncology

Medical and Cancer Services Division

The Medical and Cancer Services Division is one of six divisions within the Chief Operations Officer Directorate of Austin Health. The Division's clinical services operate across all three Austin Health campuses and Ballarat Health Services (BHS) within the Ballarat Regional Integrated Cancer Centre (BRICC) and comprise a complex range of national, state-wide organisational wide and speciality clinical services.

Cancer Services

Austin Health is one of the largest cancer service providers in Victoria. A complete range of services are delivered to patients and their families, including medical oncology, clinical haematology, radiation oncology (Austin Health and BHS), cancer genetics, palliative care, wellness and supportive care programs, an active volunteer program and specialist cancer surgery (managed via a separate Division). These are all provided in an environment that integrates research, teaching and training.

Austin Health has recently undertaken a major redevelopment of the Cancer Services

physical facilities. All Austin Health metropolitan based Cancer Services are now delivered within the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Research and Wellness Centre (ONJCRWC) at the Austin Hospital. This state of the art facility provides a new model of individualised cancer care for patients and their families.

Clinical Services are provided in a range of inpatient and ambulatory settings. Inpatient services include an acute oncology/clinical haematology ward, an oncology/surgical oncology ward and a palliative care ward. Ambulatory services include Radiation Oncology, Day Oncology, Apheresis, and multidisciplinary cancer clinics.

A Cancer Clinical Trials Centre manages trials in inpatient and ambulatory settings. Cancer Services has a strong research focus that is recognised internationally, and has a close affiliation with the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Research Institute (ONJCRI).

The Olivia Newton-John Cancer Research Institute (ONJCRI) has been established, with a focus on world-class basic and translational cancer research. The ONJCRI is the successor to the Ludwig Institute for Cancer Research (LICR), based at the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Research & Wellness Centre at the Austin Hospital in Heidelberg.

The ONJCRI has entered into a research collaboration agreement with La Trobe University resulting in the creation of the School of Cancer Medicine at the ONJCRI site, associated with the La Trobe Institute for Molecular Sciences (LIMS) within the Faculty of Science, Health and Engineering. The strategic co-location of research laboratories and research training within a clinical environment enables clinicians and researchers to work together to integrate clinical medicine with basic and translational cancer research for the ultimate benefit of cancer patients.

Austin Health is also the host agency for the North-Eastern Metropolitan Integrated Cancer Service (NEMICS), a cancer care network which also includes Eastern Health, Northern Health and Mercy Hospital for Women. NEMICS is responsible for co-ordinating and supporting a number of cancer improvement initiatives at Austin Health and other sites. Austin Health is also a key member and supporter of the North and West Metropolitan Region Palliative Care Consortium.

Mercy Hospital for Women (MHW) Gynae-oncology Service

The Department of Gynaecology Oncology is a quaternary referral service that provides comprehensive holistic and patient-centred gynaecological cancer in a multidisciplinary setting to women across Victoria and interstate to approximately 500 new gynaecological cancers per year. The current scope of the service enables women to receive continuity of high-quality specialised diagnosis, treatment and follow-up care provided by a multidisciplinary team of gynaecological oncologists, medical oncologists, specialist nursing, allied health and supportive care staff.

- Key services provided include;
- Diagnosis and treatment of Gynaecological malignancy
- Chemotherapy
- Medical Oncology
- Complex gynaecological and pelvic surgery
- Evaluation/Colposcopy and treatment of abnormal lower genital tract screening tests
- Day surgery Procedures
- Palliative care

• Physiotherapy, Dietetics, Social Work and Pastoral Care Services

Additional coordinated care and services are facilitated via collaboration and linkages with other key partners and service providers. This includes Austin Health (diagnostic imaging services, anatomical pathology, radiotherapy services, familial cancer genetic services, colorectal surgery, inpatient palliative care, clinical trials and wellness services). Other links and referral pathways include but are not limited to Bendigo Health, Northern Health, Banksia Palliative care, Warrnambool, North East Health (Wangaratta) and Central Gippsland Health (Sale Hospital)

Purpose and Accountabilities

Role Specific:

As the Tumour Stream Lead:

- Provide clinical specialization and leadership in gynae-oncology, including but not limited to:
- Leadership in outpatient clinics including clinics at Mercy Hospital for Women and consultative services for inpatients at Mercy Hospital for Women
- Leadership and governance of oncology participation in multidisciplinary meetings (MDM's)
- Governance of protocol development and review of gynae-oncology protocols including alignment of relevant protocols in the department manual and Cerner Oncology regimens as well as treatment regimens delivered at Mercy Hospital for Women
- Coordination of research and clinical trial activity in gynae-oncology, including substantive principal investigator roles and ensuring optimal research activity and governance. This includes development and maintenance of a comprehensive trial portfolio, supervision of research fellows, leadership of the relevant trials team and participation in the trials team meetings.
- Leadership of quality monitoring and service improvement in gynae-oncology, including but not limited to alignment with the Cancer Optimal Care Pathways and DHHS performance and quality indicators
- Ensuring optimal integration of wellness and supportive care, and optimization of the patient experience in gynae-oncology.
- Partner with the Mercy Hospital for Women Director of Gynae-oncology in leading the medical oncology component of the gynae-oncology service.
- Advise the Mercy Hospital for Women Director of Gynae-oncology and Director of Medical Services, on clinical service delivery considerations including, but not limited to, the acquisition and implementation of new techniques and equipment as appropriate.

Role Generic:

- Be responsible for the care of inpatients and outpatients with cancer at Austin Health, and associated hospitals
- Rostered clinical duties include inpatient ward service (as directed by the Head of Department) and attendance at outpatient clinics and day oncology as directed by the Head of Department)
- Partake in on-call duties equitably with colleagues
- Be fully involved in the clinical research activities of the Unit.
- Undertake a major role in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching as required
- Attend medical oncology Departmental Unit meetings
- Attend and actively participate in the Medical Oncology Senior Staff Meeting
- To assist the Director in administrative duties as required including participation in committees and interview panels
- To assist in the evaluation of the delivery of services and in implementing appropriate quality and risk management initiatives.
- Demonstrate a commitment to working as a team member with peer medical, junior medical, nursing and other clinical staff to provide efficient, safe and quality care across the continuum.

Teaching, Training and Research:

- Contribute to the supervision, education and training of junior medical, nursing and other clinical staff, including participating in their performance appraisal and feedback processes.
- Participate in both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching activities.
- Commitment to facilitate, conduct and participate in clinical and/or basic research.
 - Participate in the auditing and review of clinical practices to improve clinical outcomes.

All Employees:

- Support staff under management to comply with policies, procedures and mandatory training and continuing professional development requirements

Credentialing and Scope of Clinical Practice

Core Scope of Clinical Practice – Procedures, therapies and competencies that a Fellow from the respective specialist medical college would be competent in practicing. This only applies to practice at Austin Health and its campuses/services.

All Medical Oncologists should be competent in the following areas.

- have knowledge of the nature, pathology, natural history, epidemiology, and genetics of human malignant disease
- have experience in the methods of investigation and management of patients with malignancy, including screening for early detection and diagnosis by appropriate methods such as clinical examination, pathological techniques, and imaging procedures
- have an adequate understanding of the pharmacology, pharmacokinetics, use and side effects of anti-neoplastic drugs, including cytotoxics, hormonal therapies, molecular targeted agents and biological agents
- be proficient in the prevention and treatment of the complications of malignant disease
- have experience in the supportive management of cancer patients, including symptom palliation and rehabilitation with particular emphasis on psychological and social support
- display high levels of communication skills
- have an understanding of the importance of a multidisciplinary approach to the management and treatment of malignant disease
- have an understanding of evolving areas of medical oncology, including geriatric oncology, adolescent/young adult patients, and survivorship issues
- have an understanding of the role of radiotherapy in the management of patients with cancer
- have an understanding of the role of palliative care in the management of patients with cancer
- have an understanding of haematology practice with special reference to the haematological side effects of treatments and the management of haematological malignancies
- be familiar with the role of curative and palliative surgery in the management of patients with malignancy

- have experience in the development of new agents, including protocol development and implementation
- have an understanding of the appropriate methods of statistical design and analysis, so as to evaluate research reports with an appropriate depth of understanding.

Medical Oncologists should also be competent at the following procedures:

- Treat effusions by paracentesis, needle or intercostal catheter
- Perform a lumbar puncture and administer chemotherapy by that route
- Access and care for indwelling venous catheters
- Use a subcutaneous device to administer medication
- Recognise and solve the complications of a subcutaneous device
- Administer chemotherapy through an Ommaya reservoir

This will be assumed if the Medical Oncologist has a Fellowship of Royal Australasian College of Physicians in Medical Oncology or equivalent and an ongoing continuous practice in this specialty.

Extended Scope of Clinical Practice – Procedures, therapies and competencies that a Fellow from the respective specialist medical college would be competent in practicing after additional training, qualifications and experience as determined by the Director/Head of Unit.

The Director/Head of Unit is expected to apply guidelines from the respective specialist medical college and/or appropriate state, national and international bodies. Where guidelines are not explicitly available, the Director/Head of Unit must apply 'best-practice' principles to ensure safe clinical care.

• No Extended Scopes of Clinical Practice have been approved at Austin Health for Medical Oncology.

Emergency/Life threatening situation – In a medical emergency situation, any medical staff member who is credentialed at Austin Health is permitted to provide necessary patient care, as best able, and outside their defined scope of clinical practice in order to provide life-saving measures and/or to prevent serious harm.

Please note – Recognising the dynamic and rapidly advancing nature of medical practice, if you believe a novel competence, practice or procedure should be included within your specialty's scope of clinical practice, please speak to your Head of Unit and refer to the 'Introduction of a New Technology / Clinical Practice' policy on the Pulse.

For general accreditation the following need to be satisfied

- Demonstrated continuing professional development
- Regular attendance at audit
- Participation in one or more of the following
 - Teaching or research
 - o Organising audit
 - Clinical governance

Some or all of the following criteria will be used to assess accreditation

- Specialist training or a specific fellowship
- Significant accumulated total experience in the field
- Recent experience (adequate number of cases per year in previous years)
- Satisfactory completion of an acceptable outside organisations credentialing requirements.

Selection Criteria

Essential Knowledge and skills:

- A commitment to Austin Health values.
- Must be a registered Medical Practitioner in Australia with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA).
- Hold a Fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians or its equivalent
- Have appropriate training and experience applicable to the field of Medical Oncology
- Experience and major interest in the clinical management of a specialty area.
- Demonstrated commitment to high quality patient care.
- Demonstrated commitment and ongoing activity in research and/or clinical audit activities.
- Involvement in teaching and training of medical, technical and nursing staff, including at undergraduate and post-graduate level.
- Attendance and active involvement in relevant departmental, organisational and external meetings (i.e. College, Association and National/International bodies).
- Demonstrates engagement, teamwork and collaboration.
- Have demonstrated ability to communicate effectively at all levels.
- Have demonstrated understanding of, and commitment to Clinical Governance.

Desirable but not essential:

- Previous experience in gynae-oncology as a Medical Oncologist.
- Previous leadership skills and experience.
- A sound understanding of information technology including clinical systems.
