Position Purpose

The role includes provision of music therapy to patients and families from a patient-centered interdisciplinary model. This is informed by a evidence-informed framework that embraces holistic and creative focused interventions with patients across their cancer experience. The role is a clinical role providing both individual and group interventions as well as student supervision and education.

About Cancer Services

Medical and Cancer Services Division

The Medical and Cancer Division is one of four CSU's within the Operations Directorate of Austin Health. The CSU's clinical services operate across all three Austin Health campuses and Ballarat Health Services (BHS) within the Ballarat Regional Integrated Cancer Centre (BRICC) and comprise a complex range of national, state-wide organisational wide and specialty clinical services.

Cancer Services

Austin Health is one of the largest cancer service providers in Victoria. A complete range of services are delivered to patients and their families, including medical oncology, clinical haematology, radiation oncology (Austin Health and BHS), cancer genetics, palliative care, wellness and supportive care programs, an active volunteer program and specialist cancer surgery (managed via a separate CSU). These are all provided in an environment that integrates research, teaching and training.

All Austin Health metropolitan-based Cancer Services are now delivered within the Olivia Newton-John Cancer & Wellness Centre (ONJ Centre) at the Austin Hospital. This state-of-the-art facility provides a new model of individualised cancer care for patients and their families.

Clinical Services are provided in a range of inpatient and ambulatory settings. Inpatient services include an acute oncology/clinical haematology ward, an oncology/surgical oncology ward and a palliative care ward. Ambulatory services include Radiation Oncology, Day Oncology, Apheresis, and multidisciplinary cancer clinics.

Wellness and Supportive Care, Cancer Services

The integrated model of multidisciplinary care within Cancer Services relies on a dynamic, appropriately qualified, and skilled team to support patients undergoing care in

both the Inpatient and Ambulatory settings, with a key focus on Integrated Wellness and Supportive Care.

Arts in Health Care

This is part of the integrated multidisciplinary care within Cancer Services and is an integral part of the Wellness and Supportive care model. The program focuses on enabling the process of meaning making through creative interventions to help patients and families make sense of their experiences. Creativity is at the heart of the program, and it is fundamental to human experience, identity, and personal narratives.

Purpose and Accountabilities

Role Specific:

The successful music therapist must have the ability to work within a multidisciplinary context and will need to demonstrate experience in planning and delivering appropriate evidence-based music therapy interventions and supports to patients and carers in oncology settings. This clinical-focused role works across both inpatients and outpatients settings.

The position involves:

- Planning and delivering tailored, high quality music therapy services to cancer patients and their carers individually or in groups
- Participating in Wellness and Supportive Care team activities including attending meetings, assisting in generating referrals and performing service evaluations.
- Participating in, and contributing to relevant multidisciplinary team meetings
- Delivering in service education to ward staff and clinical teams to educate, generate referrals and provide engagement and connection
- Contributing to quality projects within the service
- Supervision of music therapy students
- Participating in regular supervision and performance development
- Accepting responsibility for professional development through review of own performance and identification of learning opportunities.
- Assisting in the coordination of external performances for festive periods including fundraising events

All Employees:

- Minimum three years clinical experience as a Music Therapist

- Ability to undertake assessment of clients' needs and priorities to aid development of appropriate music therapy interventions and supports; and refer to other programs and supports as required.
- Ability to prioritise workloads, work independently and within a multidisciplinary team environment.
- Demonstrated high level of organisational and excellent time management skills.
- Willingness to learn and be mentored by senior staff.
- Facilitate group programs for clients either independently or in conjunction with other specialist professionals.
- Must be a team player with the ability to work closely and collaboratively with medical, nursing, and allied health staff to improve patient outcomes.
- Demonstrate the ability to sing, and play at least one accompanying instrument (piano, guitar, and percussion).
- The ability to play a second instrument (orchestral or accompanying) will be an advantage.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- A sound understanding of information technology including clinical systems and applications relevant to the Management of rostering and risk management

Desirable but not essential:

- Interest or experience in quality activities and/or program development
- Experience in using technology applications in music therapy
