### Position purpose

There are two Nuclear Medicine Registrar (Advanced Trainee) positions available in 2027. The Nuclear Medicine Registrar is responsible for patients prior to, during, and following their procedures or radionuclide therapies, attend to the patient's medical needs, and assisting with enquires from referrers and drafting procedure reports.

The positions objectives are to perform the duties of this position efficiently to the standards of the Department, including participating in the Austin Health performance appraisal program. To work as an integral member of the Department in providing a best practice Nuclear Medicine, PET and Radionuclide Therapy service with due regard to administered doses of radiation. A close association with referrers to the Department will be a priority, as will participation with other medical and departmental staff.

### About the Directorate/Division/Department

The Department is the largest facility of its kind within the State and has an international reputation for clinical service, teaching, training and research. The Department is currently located on two campuses that are situated one kilometre apart. The Austin Campus has four SPECT/CT gamma

cameras, two clinical PET/CT scanners and one research PET/CT scanner, an 18MeV cyclotron and a research cyclotron, extensive laboratories, and Pharmacy, Physics and Chemistry support. The Repatriation Campus has the Bone Density & Mineral Research Unit (BDMRU) which is also part of the Department and is involved in a number of international clinical trials and several studies being conducted by staff within the Endocrine Centre of Excellence.

Clinical services are provided for Austin Health patients as well as privately referred patients from a wide range of specialists and general practitioners spread across a large region of metropolitan Melbourne and its fringe. In addition, selected diagnostic scans and therapy studies are provided for patients from a state-wide referral base.

## Position responsibilities

### Role Specific:

- The Registrar will be under the supervision of a Nuclear Medicine Consultant at all times.
- The Registrar will take relevant history from general Nuclear Medicine and PET patients to assist with scan interpretation and administration of radiopharmaceuticals.
- The Registrar will assist with the performance of myocardial perfusion stress tests, obtaining informed consent, relevant medical history and insertion of IV cannula.
- The Registrar will assist in the administration of Radionuclide Therapies, including admission and discharge paperwork.
- The Registrar will cover for other Registrars and Fellows within the department as needed.
- The Registrar will assist with Education and Training of the Rotating Radiology and General Medical Registrars.
- Attendance and participation in tutorials, quality assurance and clinical meetings as directed.
