Position purpose

To perform the duties required of an Anatomical Pathology registrar and to make progress in specialist training in the discipline of Anatomical Pathology.

About the Directorate/Division/Department

Our Mission: Austin Anatomical Pathology exists to provide expert, clinically focused anatomical pathology diagnostics, and to progress the field of pathology through education and research.

Austin Pathology is Victoria's largest and most comprehensive provider of pathology services. It provides laboratory pathology testing to all the campuses of Austin Health, as well as Mercy Hospital for Women, Bendigo Health, Goulburn Valley Health, and a range of other regional sites, including onsite laboratories in Bendigo, Shepparton, Swan Hill, Echuca and Mildura. This service is provided in a manner consistent with the needs of a university teaching hospital and the strategic direction of Austin Health. High volume tests and most complex low volume testing are performed at the Austin Hospital.

Austin Pathology operates in the community, both public and private, supported through a number of outreach facilities and a substantial courier network. Specialised testing is provided to a number of external clients including other public and private pathology laboratories.

Austin Health Pathology's **Department of Anatomical Pathology** is a comprehensive service, providing specialty diagnostic expertise in a wide range of areas. Our range of expertise includes molecular diagnostics, gastrointestinal and hepatobiliary disease, neuropathology, gynaecological pathology, skin, lung, urology, head and neck, breast, lymphoma, medical renal, endocrine, and cytology (gynaecological and non-gynaecological). We provide non-coronial adult and perinatal autopsy services (the latter includes membership of the Victorian Perinatal Autopsy Service). We employ more than 20 anatomical pathologists and 6 registrars.

The Department plays an important role in undergraduate and postgraduate teaching and research, and is closely affiliated with Austin Health clinical departments, Bendigo Health, University of Melbourne, other Institutes and universities, and the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia.

Austin Pathology is managed by the Pathology Executive, which is responsible for overseeing both the clinical service and business performance aspects of the Pathology Service.

Location: From December 2025 Anatomical Pathology medical staff are based at both Heidelberg and Bendigo. Most of our registrars (about 5 EFT) will be based in Heidelberg, with one based full time in Bendigo. All registrars may be required to undertake short term rotations to Bendigo to cover leave and the Bendigo-based registrar to attend educational activities in Heidelberg. Financial, accommodation and other support will be provided for short term rotations.

About Bendigo Hospital – an ~800 bed service including inpatient medical, surgical and oncology, 1600 obstetric deliveries per annum, specialist clinics, renal dialysis and a comprehensive imaging service. The Bendigo-based pathology service thus incorporates a range of simple to complex cases in histology and cytology, which we aim to report mostly on site. This includes, but is not limited to, gastrointestinal, breast, lung, gynaecology, urology, head and neck, lymphoma. Some highly specialised areas (eg medical renal, gynaecological cytology) are reported by experts at the Heidelberg site.

Laboratory activities (including macroscopic cut up, specimen processing, routine and special stains, immunohistochemistry, cytology specimen preparation), as well as adult and perinatal post mortems, are undertaken at the central Heidelberg laboratory.

Specimen triage, frozen sections and a rapid on-site cytology assessment service are offered on site at Bendigo during business hours.

Bendigo-based pathologists and registrars support multidisciplinary meetings on site (in person or virtually), currently about 15 per month.

They are expected to work closely and collaboratively with the Austin anatomical pathology team.

Austin Pathology is committed to implementing a comprehensive digital pathology solution for primary reporting, using whole slide imaging and artificial intelligence tools, in the medium term. Our Bendigo-based service will be at the forefront of this process, which we expect to be partially implemented by 2026, including for diagnosis, second opinions and educational purposes.









Position responsibilities

Role Specific:

- To perform supervised surgical cut up, fine needle aspirates, histology and cytology reporting
 to a high standard as would be expected of a trainee in a tertiary referral laboratory, as rostered
 by the Director of Anatomical Pathology.
- To perform hospital (non-coronial) adult and perinatal autopsies, including the preparation of timely written reports, to a high standard.
- To accept direction in the performance of all clinical duties by members of the Anatomical Pathology medical and scientific staff, where appropriate
- To prepare and present clinico-pathological meetings, under supervision and as rostered by the Director of Anatomical Pathology, or delegate
- To participate in undergraduate medical teaching and scientist teaching, as rostered by the Director of Anatomical Pathology
- To participate in quality assurance activities
- To participate in audit, process improvement and research activities
- To make progress in specialist training in the discipline of Anatomical Pathology

Bendigo-based registrar

- This position is most suitable for a senior (post part 1) trainee
- Duties include all of the above, except there is no requirement to perform surgical cut-up (triage only), or autopsies
- Regional-based registrar(s) will be provided with opportunities and support to participate in Heidelberg-based educational activities, virtually and in person

Selection criteria

Essential skills and experience:

- A commitment to Austin Health values
- Registration as a Medical Practitioner with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) (note eligible applicants will be assisted through this process).
- Have appropriate training and experience applicable to the field of Anatomical Pathology.
- Demonstrated commitment to high quality patient care
- Demonstrated teamwork and collaboration
- Demonstrated ability to communicate at all levels
- Approved for selection by a representative panel convened by the Victorian training coordinators of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia
- (Bendigo-based registrar only) Completion of 3 years in AP training program, Pass in Part 1 RCPA exams, satisfactory completion of DOPS, portfolio requirements and supervisor reports
