Position purpose

To provide Rehabilitation Medicine services to Austin Health during the Neuro Rehab consultant's long service leave.

About Continuing Care division, Rehabilitation Medicine Department

Continuing Care division includes Rehabilitation Medicine, Aged Care, community services and specialist clinics. Rehabilitation Medicine provides consults to the acute campus, inpatient rehabilitation services at Royal Talbot and Rehab@Home in the community. Rehabilitation Medicine also provides the Statewide spinal and ABI services and multiple outpatient clinics to assist people living with new onset disability to integrate back into the community safely. Rehabilitation Medicine works closely with our Aged Care colleagues.

Position responsibilities

- Provide comprehensive management of rehabilitation consults, inpatients and outpatients, as needed.
- Participate in Unit meetings and activities, as needed.
- Provide an on-call service as required.
- Participate in the auditing and review of clinical practices and implementing appropriate quality and risk management initiatives to improve clinical outcomes, as needed.
- Demonstrate a commitment to working as a team member with medical, nursing, allied health and other clinical staff to provide efficient, safe and quality care across the continuum.
- Contribute to the supervision, education and training of advanced trainees, junior medical, nursing, allied health and other clinical staff, including participating in their performance appraisal and feedback processes, as needed.
- Participate in both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching activities, as needed.
- Assist the Director, Rehabilitation Medicine, in administrative duties as required, including initiating and updating policies and procedures to reflect best practice and evidence-based medicine, as needed.

Credentialing and Scope of Clinical Practice

- Diagnose and assess a person's function associated with injury, illness or chronic conditions, to maximise their independence and improve and maintain quality of life
- Provide specialist knowledge and expertise in the prevention, assessment, management and medical supervision of a person with a disability
- Evaluate medical, social, emotional, work and recreational aspects of function and work with children and adults using an evidence-based collaborative approach with other disciplines, having a unique overview of the skills and expertise of other health professionals, to develop a patient-centred, individualised treatment plan in a range of settings
- Manage neurological disorders (e.g. stroke, cerebral palsy, spinal injury, brain injury, spasticity and MS)
- Manage musculoskeletal and orthopaedic conditions (including fractures, joint replacements, arthritis, osteoporosis, and sporting injuries)
- Manage acute and chronic pain (including back, neck and nerve pain)
- Manage amputations
- Manage occupational injuries
- Manage cardiorespiratory disorders
- Manage other complex or chronic conditions (including cancer and burns)

Extended SCOPE

- Botulinum Toxin treatment - Evidence of training and competence (i.e. letter of competency from training supervisor, minimum of 5 supervised injections) or experience (20 cases per annum) and recency of practice (10 cases in last 12 months).
- Botulinum Toxin treatment (sialorrhea)
- Interventional techniques for spasticity management (utilising electrical stimulation and/or ultrasound guidance, as required) - Evidence of training and competence (i.e. letter of competency from training supervisor, minimum of 5 supervised injections) or experience (20 cases per annum) and recency of practice (10 cases in last 12 months).
- Intrathecal pump management

Selection criteria



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Essential skills and experience:

- A commitment to Austin Health values.
- Have appropriate training and experience applicable to the field of Rehabilitation Medicine.
- Demonstrated commitment to high quality patient care.
- Demonstrated commitment and ongoing activity in research and/or clinical audit activities.
- Involvement in teaching and training of medical, technical and nursing staff, including at undergraduate and post-graduate level.
- Attendance and active involvement in relevant departmental, organisational and external meetings (i.e. College, Association and National/International bodies).
- Demonstrates engagement, teamwork and collaboration.
- Have demonstrated ability to communicate effectively at all levels.
- Have demonstrated understanding of, and commitment to Clinical Governance.

Desirable but not essential:

- A sound understanding of information technology including clinical systems.

Professional qualifications and registration requirements

- Must be a registered Medical Practitioner in Australia with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA).
- Hold a Fellowship of the Australasian Faculty of Rehabilitation Medicine or its equivalent.
