Position purpose

Pharmacy technicians, under the supervision of a pharmacist, assist in the various activities of the pharmacy department. The daily job responsibilities are determined by the area of service that the technician is working in. The Austin pharmacy department is focused on growing the pharmacy technician workforce to support the expanded scope of technicians in to support pharmaceutical care in our facilities.

The main objectives of this position may include:

- Assist in the provision of inpatient and outpatient pharmacy services.
- Assist in aseptic, non-sterile production and cytotoxic preparation.
- Repackage pharmaceutical products.

- Support inventory management and medication distribution activities.

About the Directorate/Division/Department

The Pharmacy Department sits within the Division of the Chief Medical Officer and provides comprehensive high-quality care to Austin Health patients and supports other members of the healthcare team in all aspects of medicines management. The department consists of a skilled team of pharmacists, technicians and support staff working across all three campuses of Austin Health to ensure patients receive excellent care

Position responsibilities

Outpatient pharmacy

- Receive and process prescriptions, referring to the pharmacist as required.
- Dispense medicines accurately using the Merlin Dispensing System and systematic checking procedures.
- Maintain stock levels, complete expiry checks, and manage returns from wards in line with guidelines.
- Handle telephone enquiries and perform cash reconciliation as required.
- Collate and review PBS prescriptions to ensure compliance.
- Assist with training and orientation of new pharmacy staff and perform other assigned duties.
- Perform other tasks as assigned.

Inpatient pharmacy

- Assist pharmacists with inpatient, leave, and discharge dispensing in line with hospital guidelines.
- Support PBS administration and hospital formulary requirements.
- Communicate effectively with pharmacists and the wider healthcare team regarding ward imprest, dispensing, and stock control.
- Pack medication administration aids as requested.
- Perform stock control and imprest duties, including processing returned inpatient medicines and managing unwanted stock according to guidelines.
- Complete expiry checks in allocated areas.
- Participate in staff training, orientation, and quality assurance activities as required.
- Perform other tasks as assigned.

Pharmaceutical manufacturing and prepacking

- Performs aseptic compounding of parenteral admixtures and manufacture non-sterile products and pre-packaging of selected pharmaceutical items..
- Participate in cytotoxic compounding (after completion of an approved aseptic cytotoxic preparation course).
- Interact effectively with other members of the health care team.
- Perform inventory management including stock rotation, expiry date checking, ordering, and receiving for the area.
- Participate in quality assurance activities.
- Perform other tasks as assigned.



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Selection criteria

- Effective communication skills
- Strong attention to detail
- Ability to work independently
- Ability to work as part of a team
- Prior hospital pharmacy experience

Desirable but not essential:

- Experience utilizing Merlin, Cerner, and HS8

Professional qualifications and registration requirements

- Minimum 3 years of full time experience as a qualified Pharmacy Technician.
- Completion of a Certificate IV Health (Hospital Pharmacy Technician) course awarded by a registered training organisation or equivalent qualification.
