Position purpose

Austin Health Pathology is seeking a suitably qualified and experienced Chemical Pathologist to provide a diagnostic service in all aspects of Chemical Pathology. The appointee will support the Director of Chemical Pathology in providing oversight and support of biochemistry laboratory testing at Heidelberg, and at the regional laboratory sites for which Austin Health Pathology are responsible.

The role will also provide support and clinical oversight to the Point of Care Service provided by Austin Health Pathology.

About the Directorate/Division/Department

Austin Health Pathology provides services to Austin Health and the co-located Mercy Hospital for Women, and also numerous GPs and Specialists in the community. In addition, Austin Pathology has also taken on responsibility for a number of regional laboratories in the northwest region of Victoria. The laboratories included are: Echuca, Swan Hill, Shepparton, and Mildura. Austin Pathology also provide oversight to a number of point-of-care sites including: Castlemaine, Seymour, Kyneton, Kerang, Cohuna and Kyabram. The anticipation is that this regional expansion will continue and more regional laboratories will become part of the Austin pathology network.

Austin Pathology is located on Levels 5 and 6 of the Harold Stokes Building. Austin Pathology comprises 34 full and part-time pathologists, 11 Registrars/Fellows, Medical Scientists, and Administrative Staff.

Austin Pathology is committed to providing high quality patient care through routine and specialised diagnostic services, expert advice and support for teaching and research.

Austin Pathology is an accredited laboratory with the National Association of Testing Authorities Australia (NATA), the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia (RCPA), National Safety and Quality Health Services Standards (NSQHS), National Pathology Accreditation Advisory Council and Medicare Australia, supported by a network of Collection Centres at hospital sites and within the community.

Position responsibilities

In conjunction with the Director, Chemical Pathology and the senior Biochemistry laboratory team the successful candidate would be expected to:

- Manage and coordinate all medical aspects of the Biochemistry Department across all Austin Pathology sites. This includes Biochemistry in the central and regional laboratories, point-of-care sites and any future areas that become the responsibility of Biochemistry.
- Be responsible to the Medical Director of Pathology for the timely provision of high quality, well-presented Biochemistry results and for ensuring the communication and notification of critical risk results.
- Be responsible for setting and monitoring Key Performance Indicators, and for monitoring test numbers and workload for all areas of Biochemistry.
- Participate in Unit meetings and activities.
- Provide an on-call service as required.
- Provide a consultative service to other Units as required.
- Provide supervision visits to the regional laboratories as required to fulfil the supervision requirements provided by NATA
- To assist the Director, Chemical Pathology and Medical Director in administrative duties as required including the development and review of policies and procedures for the provision of services, updating as needed to reflect best practice and evidence-based medicine.
- To assist in the evaluation of the delivery of services and in implementing appropriate quality and risk management initiatives.
- Demonstrate a commitment to working as a team member with peer medical, junior medical, nursing and other clinical staff to provide efficient, safe and quality care across the continuum.
- Ensure that all Department Policies and Procedures for Internal Quality Control and External Quality Assurance are practiced and maintained.
- Be responsible for ensuring that documentation relevant to the Biochemistry Department is written to NATA specifications and up-to-date. Assist in the preparation of Department Policy and Procedure Manuals when required. Ensure that all records are kept in accordance with NATA, HIC, NPAAC and other relevant guidelines.









Additionally, the successful candidate is expected to:

Essential skills and experience:

- Must hold current Fellowship of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia in Chemical Pathology
- Must have appropriate training and experience applicable to the field of Chemical Pathology
- Must provide evidence of up to date compliance with Continued Professional Development requirements
- Must demonstrate commitment to high quality patient care.
- Must demonstrate commitment and ongoing activity in research and/or clinical audit activities.
- Should be able to demonstrate ability to engage in teamwork and collaboration.
- Will be required to demonstrate ability to communicate effectively at all levels.
- Should be able to provide evidence of their commitment to Clinical Governance

Desirable but not essential:

- Evidence of attendance and active involvement in relevant departmental, organisational and external meetings (i.e. College, Association and National/International bodies).
- Evidence of involvement in teaching and training of medical, technical and nursing staff, including at undergraduate and post-graduate level.
