Position purpose

The purpose of this position is to provide further training to the registrar in chemical pathology to allow for completion of training time requirements and to support the candidate to successfully complete the Part 2 training requirements.

About the Directorate/Division/Department

Austin Health Pathology provides services to Austin Health and the co-located Mercy Hospital for Women, and also numerous GPs and Specialists in the community. In addition, Austin Pathology has also taken on responsibility for a number of regional laboratories in the northwest region of Victoria. The laboratories included are: Echuca, Swan Hill, Shepparton, and Mildura. Austin Pathology also provide oversight to a number of point-of-care sites including: Castlemaine, Seymour, Kyneton, Kerang, Cohuna and Kyabram. The anticipation is that this regional expansion will continue and more regional laboratories will become part of the Austin pathology network.

Austin Pathology is located on Levels 5 and 6 of the Harold Stokes Building. Austin Pathology comprises 34 full and part-time pathologists, 11 Registrars/Fellows, Medical Scientists, and Administrative Staff.

Austin Pathology is committed to providing high quality patient care through routine and specialised diagnostic services, expert advice and support for teaching and research.

Austin Pathology is an accredited laboratory with the National Association of Testing Authorities Australia (NATA), the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia (RCPA), National Safety and Quality Health Services Standards (NSQHS), National Pathology Accreditation Advisory Council and Medicare Australia, supported by a network of Collection Centres at hospital sites and within the community.

Position responsibilities

The successful applicant will report to the Director of Chemical Pathology, or their delegate and be trained in the following:

- An understanding and ability to perform analytical laboratory techniques
- To assist in validation of laboratory results, evaluation of new tests and reviewing protocols and policies
- To provide clinical liaison: provide advice to clinicians on selection and interpretation of laboratory tests, liaison regarding critical results, preparation of materials for clinical review meetings
- Observation and support in the performance of dynamic endocrine tests, interpretation and validation of the results
- To support the provision of; and provide clinical input to, the point-of-care testing services
- Involvement in quality assurance and quality improvement activities to achieve continuing high standards of pathology practices in an efficient and cost-effective manner
- Involvement in staff education and in development and assessment of research and projects
- Oversight and support of the regional laboratories, providing clinical liaison to the laboratory and the requesting clinicians, review of test repertoire ensuring that it remains appropriate and maintains quality standards
- Maintain a safe working environment for yourself, colleagues, and members of the public.

Selection criteria

Essential skills and experience:

- At least two years of postgraduate clinical experience in biochemistry
- Basic Clinical Sciences examination passed
- Successful completion of Part 1 of the FRCPA in Chemical Pathology
- Demonstrated interest in metabolic and diagnostic aspect of medicine
- Fundamental understanding of laboratory information systems and well versed in information technology

Desirable but not essential:

- Sound knowledge of statistical methods and experience with data management in a clinical research environment
- Proven ability to work as a team member with effective communication and interpersonal skills within a multidisciplinary team
- Demonstrated commitment to patient safety and clinical quality improvement activities

Professional qualifications and registration requirements

- A medical qualification (MBBS or equivalent) with current registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (APHRA)
- Evidence of successful completion of Part 1 RCPA exam in Chemical Pathology
